Conference Speakers and Session Hosts

Keynote: Professor (Emeritus) Ewart Keep, Centre on Skills, Knowledge & Organisational Performance, Department of Education, Oxford University

The evolving role of English FE Colleges – a view from 2028

This presentation takes the perspective of a view back from the year 2028. It offers one vision or trajectory of how FE has evolved between now and February 2028, argues as to why this vision gained traction, and some pointers about how this vision was delivered. The presentation also touches upon alternative, less optimistic trajectories and what, if anything, can be done to avoid them coming to pass.

Matt Bromley – Bromley Education

Working out what works in the FE classroom - Learning lessons from the most successful colleges

In this session, education author and advisor Matt Bromley explores the top 10 features of the most successful FE teachers and unpacks each feature in turn. He focuses on the role adaptive teaching can play in ensuring every learner has equal access to an ambitious curriculum but that those who start with less are given more help in the form of scaffolding, so we achieve equity and, ultimately, inclusion.

He will explore:

- o The new 'new normal' what we took away from Covid
- o The top 10 features of effective FE teaching practice
- o How to plan an ambitious, broad and balanced curriculum
- o How to sequence the curriculum to build complexity and challenge over time
- How to provide equitable access to the curriculum for learners with additional and different needs, and those at a disadvantage.

Richard Beynon, Ofsted HMI

Inspection for FE College Governors (College Governor focused session)

Richard Beynon returns to the KFE TLAC for an amazing fourth year. It is certainly the case that timing is everything and KFE is confident that this first KFE session specifically aimed at governors, clerks or senior leaders, will provide some useful findings and key messages to date from Ofsted's inspections of FE colleges under the new framework. Always informative, Richard's open and accessible approach ensures great added value and will conclude with Q&A.

Andrew Dowell – Head of Professional Status & Standards - Education and Training Foundation Utilising the Professional Standards to focus your Professional Development

The session will explore the updated version of the Professional Standards for Teachers and Trainers and look at the resources and tools available to aid your understanding of each standard. Attendees will discuss professional development opportunities to best support new teachers and consider how the standards can guide career progression for all.

Vikki Liogier – National Head of EdTech – Education and Training Foundation EdTech CPD Programme Overview & Introduction to Extended Realities (XR)

This Adapting curriculum and pedagogy to include a consideration of technology, this is not an easy task as it requires not only technology access and digital skills but, most importantly, pedagogy redefinition. In this session, Vikki will give an overview of the ETF's Enhance Digital Teaching Platform EdTech CPD programme as well as an introduction to the education opportunities brought by Extended Realities technologies. Key points explored in this session are:

- o Consider the ETF's EdTech professional development opportunities for teachers, trainers, and managers.
- o Differentiate Augmented, Virtual and Mixed Realities (AR-VR-MR)
- o Assess the pedagogical contribution of virtual reality to your area of teaching

Gemma Baker - South East Area Director and Senior Policy Lead – Association of Colleges Inspection Overview & Lessons for Further Education Colleges

This session follows on from Richard Beynon's in the Right Conference Hall. Gemma will expand on the topic of lessons from Ofsted inspections under the current framework. This session will be useful for teachers as well as middle and senior leaders seeking insights into Ofsted's thinking so far. With all three of KFE's colleges probably due inspection, and no doubt some from FEDEC and FE Sussex in the next year to two years a no doubt useful swot for all colleagues.

Teresa Frith - Senior Skills Policy Manager – Association of Colleges An Overview of the Apprenticeship Workforce Development Programme

The AWD is aimed at teachers and other staff associated with apprenticeship delivery and the Apprenticeship Accountability Framework. This session will provide work-based learning focused colleagues with a useful opportunity to find out more about the Apprenticeship Workforce Development Programme, its aims and objectives and how to engage with it.

Alison Whittle - Post 16 Technical Advisor, City & Guilds Looking at the T in T Levels (T-Level Developments & Support)

City & Guilds works with a huge range of FE colleges across many curriculum areas traditionally in the apprenticeship and work-based learning space. Our colleges are introducing T Levels at an increasing rate and this session aims to outline C&G's approach, developments and support available to colleges that work with them as a T Level awarding organisation. Alison's session will explore:

- o What's here
- What's coming
- o What support is available
- How to access the resources

Nathan Pascall-Smith & Wayne Wilson - NHS Kent & Medway (Integrated Care Board) Kent & Medway Health and Care Academy

KFE's work with the ICB and NHS employers across the county was consolidated by an MoU in November 2022. There are several exciting developments and projects evolving as a result of this collaboration with the county's largest collective employer organisation. This session will give an overview and update on the prospective Kent & Medway Health and Care Academy which will be key to providing FE college learners information and access to NHS careers and WEX placements. Jonathan Smith – EKC Group, on behalf of KFE's collective Skills Development Fund Project 2 Developments in the Immersive Curriculum

This session aims to provide a brief overview and dissemination concerning the roll out of the SDF2 immersive learning focused work. This includes the development of immersive classroom facilities and learning technologies including AI and VR tools to support learners and learning. This session will be of interest to those that wish to keep updated on the collective work of all three colleges and what the evolving curriculum and TLA implications will be for this exciting work on a practical level.

Colin Galley – FE Standards and Quality Manager, World Skills UK Integrating competition into curriculum

KFE leads the way in the sector as one partnership that has for many years embedded learner skills competitions into its collaborative activities. On 10th March 2023 the next KFE4Skills competition day takes place. This will be the third single day competition event for KFE engaging over 200 students in 24 industry competitions. Colin's session will be a very timely opportunity to hear the latest developments from WSUK around its regional and national events, but very usefully Colin will highlight WSUK's work in integrating competition into the curriculum and its benefits to learners as well as its high currency with Ofsted.
