
- Please **print** the handout for use in the session. You will use this to collect important information throughout.

Additional tips for using the Digilounge:


- Here is the Digilounge conference floorplan:



- The games will be played in **groups of 4**. To join a table, simply double click on an empty seat. Please remember to leave 2 empty seats on the tables of 6.
- When I'm presenting, you'll only see me on screen, but when you're playing the game, you will be able to see, hear and speak to the 3 other members of your group. **Please keep you cameras on.**
- The winner of a 'round' is required to share their screen and read out the winning card. (All will be explained..) To share your screen, click the highlighted button below:



- Then, to make your card readable, click the 'maximise' screen button (which should be in the top right-hand corner:
