4	Core Competency	Summary of relevant education level industry competency.	The skills competition activity duration will be approximately 2 hours. Additional time for familiarisation, health and Safety and general event briefings, judging and awards should be added to this time.  Models  All competitors should choose an appropriate model that is aged 16 or above. The model will need to be suitable for competition and not be contra indicated to any services. This and any patch tests need to be completed and checked prior to the day of the competition.  All models will need to be confirmed before the event to the organisers and will be required to sign-in on event day. They will also be required to give permission for photographs and filming related to the event taking place on the day.  Competitors taking part in this competition should be able to demonstrate:  Professional demeanour Safe working practices Professional attitude Effective interaction with the client High level of skill and dexterity Management of time allocation Ergonomic working methods
5	Duration	This is the time that the actual competition activity will take.	o 2 Hours
6	The Skills Competition Task Details	This section describes the skills competition task to be undertaken in detail.	Pamper Day  This competition includes; A full Facial to include a skin analysis, an eyelash tint and Crème red polish to the finger nails.  Check points (CP) will be used, to allow the judges to mark work at various stages during the competition, these are clearly marked below. Time checks are also used to inform the judges when a competitor has

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started and finished certain tasks (TC). Competitors will be required to indicate these to the judges by raising their hand.

The competitor will take control of their own timings, there will be no breaks between treatments. The treatments must be performed in the following order;

#### Task 1: Facial & Skin Analysis.

Important note: Models should arrive with make-up pre-applied, including foundation, mascara and lipstick.

The treatment will need to include:

- Cleanse (CP make up removal)
- Tone
- Skin analysis
- Exfoliation (CP exfoliation is removal)
- Skin warming (Steam or hot Towels), extractions if needed,
- Massage (carried for 20 minutes TC)
- Mask
- Moisturise

#### Task 2: Eyelash tint.

This treatment should include:

Eyelash tint (left on for minimum of 5 minutes - TC)

Removal of tint - CP

#### Task 3: Nail Paint

(Cuticle work and filing is to be completed prior to the competition)

This treatment should include;

Crème red polish applied to all 10 nails

A completed registration is a confirmation that a competitor has agreed to the following:  Competition Rules Terms and Conditions Competition rules  Conduct for competitors during live competitions:  Competitors must set up and participate in the competition on their own. At no point should accompanying tutors, colleagues or others be in the competition area before or during the competition. Models will enter the room at the start time of the competition.  Where there are a number of competitors from a different campus attached to the same organisation, the competitor's work stations will be placed around the competition area at the discretion of the judges.  Competitors must not bring any ornaments to decorate their work area e.g. flowers, vases, etc.  Competitors must ensure that they keep to timings set by judges at the beginning of the competition, extra time will not be allocated to those who are not ready for each task.

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5.	Competitors should be dressed in beauty therapy attire and present themselves in a manner which
	would be acceptable within commercial enterprises. No jewellery or piercings to be worn.

- 6. Competitors who arrive late will not receive additional time.
- 7. Competitors will start and finish work as instructed by the judges.
- 8. During the competition, competitors should not disturb other students/teams or speak to members of the public.
- 9. Any competitor who wishes to leave the area during the competition must seek the permission of the judges.
- 10. If there is a power stoppage, breakdown of machinery or accident, the competitors must act according to the instructions of the judges.
- 11. Competitors who break or damage their own equipment during the competition will not receive additional time.
- 12. Competitors will be required to bring a model on the day. The models must not be contra-indicated to any of the treatments, they must also have previous experience of a back massage and exfoliation.
- 13. Models will be checked prior to the competitions; any found to be unsuitable will incur penalties for the competitor. Models must not aid the competitor in any way as this may affect the competitor's marks.
- 14. Competitors are responsible for supplying all products and equipment, including towels. Hosts will however provide a couch, magnification lamp, stool and trolley. Only trolleys or your own storage boxes, under the couch, should be used for products and equipment. Any items placed on sinks, shelves and cupboards in the work area will be asked to be moved.
- 15. Where a competitor is observed working in an unsafe manner, s/he will be stopped and not permitted to continue unless willing to follow the judges' directions.

All electrical equipment must be PAT tested and labelled before using at the competition and all the supporting equipment must be fit for purpose.
