1	Entry Criteria	Entrants must be in education and/or employment with training, at one of the KFE college organisations (EKC Group, MidKent College and North Kent College (including Hadlow College), and/or have completed or be undertaking a relevant Level 2 or 3 or above programme within the last 12 months.	
2	Entrant Numbers	Standard entrant number per college organisation is 2 students for most industry rounds where more than 2 college organisations are participating and 3 per organisation where only 2 colleges are participating.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Each college organisation (not campus) may register up to (2) students. ○ Confirmed max number of students in total: 6 <p>At the time of entry, the entrants must have been challenged at the level of the competition. This means that entry is only possible through a qualifying process at your local college and with the endorsement and verification of the lead staff from that college.</p>
3	Competition Prep	This section describes preparation needed for this competition.	<p>Preparatory Brief</p> <p>Web design is an extremely important skill due to the way that we communicate in this digital world. As a web designer you will have to work with clients’ requests and expectations and this competition will help you showcase these skills.</p> <p>“Open World Gaming” is looking for a website to help make their brand and shop more visible to the target audience. They have a small volume of regular customers but need to entice more people into their shop. After looking around, they like one current design trend in particular – multiple page layouts.</p>

			<p>They would like you to incorporate this into your design along with their already existing colour scheme and logo. It should also be viewable on a mobile device due to their target audience viewing websites on mobile devices.</p> <p>Pre-competition Submissions</p> <p>There is no specific pre-competition submission required. It is advised that competitors prepare a folder of research based on other gaming websites and inspirations that will help in developing their own website. THIS MUST NOT INCLUDE ANY 'CHEAT SHEETS' TO AID IN THE CODING OF A WEBSITE. Your research will be looked at during the competition.</p>

6	The Skills Competition Task Details	This section describes the skills competition task to be undertaken in detail.	<p>On the day of the competition, you will be provided with the brief and files required to complete the project. You will read the client brief carefully and understand exactly what is required by the client and then show your own creativity in creating a website.</p> <p>You will be issued a logo, colour scheme and fonts to be used for the website. You will also be issued a list of pages/tabs the company would like to have incorporated into the website. There will also be a biography of each of the team members they have written that needs to be inserted.</p> <p>You can create your own design based on the specifications given by the client. The work should be presented in a file with subfolders and directories named according to industry web standards. You will also need to provide all planning work including sketches, wireframes, prototyping etc.</p>

Panels will normally number three to five judges and in some cases may include an external judge from the industry sector or an awarding body. Judges’ decisions are final in all instances, although scoring will be open and transparent.</p>
