What are skills competitions?

Skills competitions are designed by industry experts, and assess an individual's knowledge, practical skills and employability attributes against set criteria in a competitive timed environment

- individuals benefit from the fine tuning of critical skills, attributes and behaviours valued by employers; problemsolving, self-reflection, time management and ability to work under pressure
- our programmes enable participants to bring world-class skills back to their organisations, **improving productivity**
- competitions enable business and education to **benchmark** against national and international standards of performance



Competition Stages

No. of competitors	100 +	Squad/Team Development	The progression of competitors/teams to join the selection process for Squad UK for WorldSkills is subject to meeting criteria such as age eligibility; performance and competing in the correct competition and level
	550 +	National Finals	Take place over in November and build on the complexity and challenge of the regional heats and test skills and competence against peers in a competitive, time limited environment to industry standards, showcasing excellence in skills and compete to be the best in a particular skill
	2,500 +	National Qualifiers	Competitors are entered in Spring to participate in a local competition or online test during Spring/Summer. Highest scoring competitors in each skill are invited to take part in the UK national final
	3,000 +	Entry stage	National Competitions are open to learners, apprentices and employees from 16 years + and should be either working towards or have recently completed Level 2, 3 or 4 qualifications in their related skill. This involves a simple online/remote test or task
	Circa 15,000 +	Pre-competition activities	Pre-competition activities are encouraged to support and prepare competitors for their participation in passive stages and heats. This could take the form for inter and intra college competitions and employer engagement

Intent:

- New methodology for assessment


For Learners:




